

**First Video Conference of the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Arunachal Pradesh  
with all the Deputy Commissioners : 20/08/2013**

A Video Conference of the Chief Minister, Arunachal Pradesh with all the Deputy Commissioners was organized on 20<sup>th</sup> August 2013. ## CM's video conferencing with DCs creates record



**ITANAGAR, Aug 20:** Chief Minister Nabam Tuki inked a record by being the first CM to hold video conferencing (VC) with the deputy commissioners of all districts today.

Making the best use of information technology, the CM had the interface through the VC from the conference hall of the planning department that continued for over three and half hours, which is unthinkable in a land-locked state where telecommunication poses great challenges to the service providers.

An array of subjects were covered including National Food Security Ordinance-2013, which the CM had launched earlier, to law and order and skill development mission, highly placed official sources told this daily.

The VC is a novel GoAP initiative to facilitate regular live audience of the CM with the DCs not only to review

all ongoing projects and schemes in the districts but also to take on-the-spot review of law and order situation from the local administrators.

All the DCs were present live from their respective offices while the CM interacted with them in presence of the chief secretary, development commissioner, commissioner to CM, planning secretary, director civil supplies and a host of legislators including lawmakers Nido Pavitro, RT Khunjuju, Karikho Kri and Bamang Felix. Few DCs had come to the nearby HQ where connectivity was available, like Anjaw DC to Tezu and Longding DC to Khonsa.

The VC was conducted by National Informatics Centre, Arunachal Pradesh and the district units under the supervision of VC division and Satcom division, NIC HQ, New Delhi.

Tuki stressed on the tar-

get of creating one lakh job opportunities in the 12<sup>th</sup> Five Year plan while asserting to achieve this year's target of 25,000 jobs in both private and public sectors including self-employment. He said that at least one person should be gainfully employed from each family and the onus was on the DCs to recommend the beneficiaries.

Informing about the two-day job mela proposed at IG Park here from August 30 next, Tuki urged the DCs to mobilize unemployed youths in their respective districts to take part in the event with assured employment.

While congratulating one and all for the highest ever revenue earning in 2012-13, the CM called for doubling the revenue this fiscal. The districts performing better will be suitably rewarded by the GoAP, he said, and urged the DCs *Contd. P.3*

The Video-Conference was conducted by National Informatics Centre, Arunachal Pradesh State and District Units under the supervision of Video Conferencing division and Satcom Division, NIC Hqrs, New Delhi.

Addressing the deputy commissioners, Tuki stressed on the target of creating one lakh job opportunities in the 12th Five Year plan while asserting that this year the target is to create at least 25000 employment avenues in both private and public sectors including self-employment. He said that at least one person should be gainfully employed from each family and the onus was on the deputy commissioners to recommend the beneficiary.

Informing of the Job Mela scheduled to be held at I G Park, Itanagar, on 30 and 31 August next, Tuki urged the deputy commissioners to mobilize unemployed youths in their respective districts to participate in it.

He also informed that the state government had earlier on the day launched the ambitious National Food Security Ordinance 2013 in the state and called upon the deputy commissioners to implement it in letter and spirit for the benefit of the poor.

"It is an extremely important scheme particularly for our state as in many remote areas people do not get enough food supplies at subsidized rates. Therefore, implementation of the scheme in the state is to be done in a systematic and time bound manner," Tuki advised.

While congratulating all for the stupendous revenue collection last year, the Chief Minister stressed on increasing it to double this year. Calling on the district administrators to contribute in revenue collection from their respective ends, he said that districts performing better in this field will be suitably rewarded by the state government.

Talking on the issue of land allotment, the Chief Minister called to ensure that land with state and central government departments be allotted to them with proper demarcation.
