Mother and Child Tracking System (MCTS) Project

Project Status: On-going

Mother and Child Tracking System (MCTS) is a web enabled name based system to monitor and ensure delivery of full spectrum of services to all pregnant women and children. The online registration system has been developed by National Informatics Centre for Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, GoI.

The Mother and Child Tracking System (MCTS) is designed to collate information of all pregnant women and infants so as to ensure delivery of maternal and child health services from conception till 42 days after delivery in the case of pregnant women and up to five years of age in the case of children so as to ensure that all pregnant women and all new born receive full maternal and immunization services.

The project is currently being implemented throughout the country with active involvement of States/UTs. More than 4.06 crore pregnant women 3.3 crore children have been registered in the system since its inception.

Everyday approximately 7-8 lakh SMSes are being sent to the beneficiaries carrying useful IEC messages related to maternal and child care, schemes like JSY, JSSK and Direct Benefit Transfer.

Regular Work plans are being sent to ANMs/ASHAs through SMS.

Daily SMSes are also being sent to senior officials of GOI and State Governments, Regional Directors, State Coordinators, District Collectors, Chief Medical Officers, District Programme Managers etc. regarding mother and child registration status, service due and delivery status.

MCTS system has been synchronised to Central Plan Schemes Monitoring System to make JSY payments online directly into the beneficiary's bank account in select pilot districts where the Direct Benefits Transfer (DBT) scheme is being rolled.

MCTS serves two vital purposes as it facilitates the service provider at the grass roots level in delivering services to women and children according to their specific needs besides supporting health managers at different tiers of the system in monitoring delivery of maternal and child health services. An innovative feature of MCTS is the application of the information technology tools for its implementation right up to the village level. The information technology based innovative approach adopted in the implementation of MCTS has resulted in the recognition of MCTS as an innovative e-governance project by the high power Committee constituted under the chairmanship of the Cabinet Secretary, Government of India.

Recently USSD (Unstructured Supplementary Service Data) has been integrated.

NIC, Arunachal Pradesh is actively working with Mission Director, National Rural Health Mission, Arunachal Pradesh in the training and implementation of the Project in Arunachal Pradesh.
